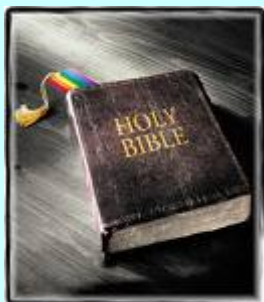


## FROM START TO FINISH

### 24 x 30' Quiz Series



**The Quiz where contestants answer questions about the *beginnings*, *middles* and *ends* of absolutely everything.**

Six players start the game, but only one will finish it.

#### In the Beginning

In this round, players take it in turn to answer questions on all sorts of beginnings, middles and ends. ***The first player to answer all three correctly in sequence secures their place in the Middle Round***, leaving the other places up for grabs as the remaining players compete on ***the buzzer***. Questions rotate from beginning to end as players compete to answer the ones they need to secure their places. Once the three places have been secured, the round ends and the two unsuccessful players are eliminated.

#### Examples

- **Starter** : What is the first word in the Bible?
- **Middle** : What's Tony Blair's middle name?
- **End**: Who was the last person to stab Julius Caesar?
- **Starter**: What's the first word in the Greek Alphabet?

Every time a player gets their question wrong, or passes, they either stay on the same level if they're at the beginning, or drop down a level if they're on a middle or end question. And can only move up to the next level after answering a question correctly. It's a race to reach the finishing line before the others.

#### In the Middle

In this round, the four remaining players again take it in turn to answer more questions on beginnings, middles and ends, but this time instead of answering three questions in a row correctly to secure a place in the End round, ***they have to answer six***. And once again, when the first player reaches six, the round turns to the buzzer. But this time players are up against the clock too, and only have **60 seconds** to try to make it through to the End Game. If after the 60 seconds, there is a tie, our host asks a tie-breaker question.

## Example Questions

- **Starter:** What's the beginning of a book called?
- **Middle:** What is the middle of a dart board called?
- **End:** What's the last word of the song Jingle Bells?
- **Starter:** What's the first event in the Decathlon?
- **Middle:** What village is geographically called the Centre of England?

## In the End

Now it's all to play for. The two remaining players face a large screen with rows of squares marked **beginning**, **middle** and **end** on them. Each set of squares has a picture, word or symbol on them that makes up a whole. Players compete on the buzzer to answer questions on beginnings, middles and ends asked by the Quiz Master. After giving a correct answer worth 10 points, the player chooses a relevant square to turn over and see if they can guess the whole. If they do, they get 50 points, if not, it's back to the buzzer. The player with the most points at the end wins.

Middle – Green Body

End – Stone Block

Whole – Statue of Liberty
